## <u>Winterizing Now Saves Money</u> and Frustration Next Year



Dr. Andrew Landers, Professor of Agricultural Engineering at Cornell University says proper cleaning and storing of your sprayer will pay dividends. Thoroughly drain tank of any residues, then run fresh water through

system until it runs clear. Some systems may require recycling a cleaning agent such as potassium hydroxide or ammonia (50 parts water to 1 part cleaner) for complete cleaning. If you have any leftover Oxidate or hydrogen peroxide laying around, it too is an excellent tank cleaner. Run the cleaning mix through the sprayer for several minutes, then drain the tank and all hoses. Make sure there's no water in the pump. If you can't be sure it's empty, run some anti-freeze into the system to prevent freeze damage to the pump. Clean and replace any worn nozzles, strainers and screens now. Rinse and scrub outside of sprayer. Store sprayer under cover.

Don't forget to winterize your propane cannons and bird alarms. We frequently make repairs on these devices that could have been avoided with good winterizing procedures. Make sure you disconnect your propane tanks. Then place a coffee can (or something similar that can't be chewed through) on the barrel of the cannon. Try to create as tight a seal as possible to prevent rodents from nesting inside. And seal your bird alarms in a rodent -proof container to prevent them from nibbling on wire insulation.

### Fall Trellising and Fencing
